What is GAIN?

The Geriatric Assessment and Intervention Network (GAIN) is a system of 12 teams located in East Scarborough, Durham, Haliburton, Peterborough, Kawartha Lakes and Northumberland Counties.

GAIN Teams provide assessment, investigation, diagnosis, treatment, education, support and care to older adults dealing with complex health concerns about:

- memory loss or confused thinking
- walking and mobility
- falls or risk of falls
- bladder and bowel control
- multiple medications
- difficulty coping
- safety issues
- frequent hospital visits

- 4. Once concerns are addressed, you will be likely discharged, with transfer of care to the most appropriate clinician or service.
